Article III Sec. 6 The Executive Board shall consist of the President, Vice President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, and 3 elected members.

Article XIV, Sec. 1.

Sec. 1. The Local Union's building and other property, located at 4903 Commerce Court, McFarland, Wisconsin, shall be owned by and in the name of IBEW Local Union 159.

Article III

Sec. 8 (g) In all references in Article III where it refers to member in good standing, members who are classified under Article X Sec. 7 (a) with a set dollar per month working dues assessment must have paid up their working dues assessment to be considered in good standing.

### **NEBF announcement**

The Trustees of the National Electrical Benefit fund (NEBF) have approved a temporary amendment to the Plan of Benefits. For the period of January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018, those persons with an effective pension date of December 2017 and earlier, may work up to 600 hours with no loss of pension benefit. ## Code Corner

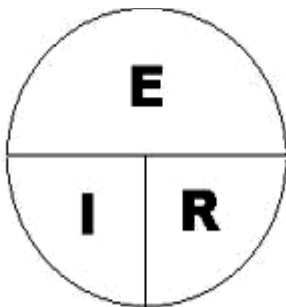
With the emergence of building with exposed ceilings, there has been a little confusion about the support of fixture whips. A “fixture whip” is a Manufactured Wiring System and is governed by Article 604 in the NEC. “604.7 Installation” states that the system shall be secured and supported in accordance with the applicable cable or conduit article for the cable or conduit type employed.

A fixture whip is flexible metal conduit with conductors installed. Article 348.20(A)(2)(b) dictates that it can be used as a part of a “listed assembly” in lengths not to exceed 6’. Article 348.30 states that FMC shall be secured within 12” of the junction box, cabinet box, conduit body, etc. and secured at intervals not to exceed 4.5’.

Exception #4 to 348.30 (A) allows us the 6’ from the last support (or the connector) to a luminaire “***within an accessible ceiling***”. That is the part that catches electricians. We only get the 6’ exception in an acoustic ceiling, not the exposed ceilings of open office areas or mechanical rooms. For the support within 12” of the luminaire, we do allow the fixture chain or cable to be used as a means of support with plastic zip-ties.

I hope this helps.
